'building envelopes.' (how dry is that?) Bob started with surveying the audience and realizing "who's who & where," said "blame it on OPEC!" All of our difficulties stem from that cartel that raised the price of fuels, requiring us to improve our energy efficiency. "R2000" was not prescriptive and the Government only tested the results of energy improvements. With R2000, we discovered mold, mildew and Urea Formaldehyde Foam Insulation that emitted toxic gasses. Yet they were happy, as energy consumption decreased. Green lumber from coastal BC rotted in those sealed walls.

BC Interior wood mills bragged that their 'kiln dried wood" did not have those problems. Fact was, kiln dried wood reduced the weight of the wood and saved shipping fees. Old coastal green lumber was 25% moisture. Gov't Regs now require that new builds have a moisture meter to show the lumber is below 14%.

Finally, the Feds realized they needed new rules and came up with 'rain screens.' After creating inside vapour proof walls and outside moisture proof walls for the insulated cavity, they needed to find a way to wick/direct away the moisture that came inside the outer layer of siding, or stucco. They perceived an added exterior space was required to allow BC's rain to drain away from the sealed wall. Thus, strapping and moisture resistant paper cover is placed over the sealed wall to divert water.

The real losers in this process of mismanagement? The owners! Some condo renovations were over \$100,000 per condo unit. Imagine, retiring early, moving to a cheaper condo, with their fixed costs, and your fixed income to be suddenly hit with an extra \$80,000 in fees. A new mortgage is no way to augment your retirement? TOUGH!

Bob, as a successful businessperson, realized they did not want to become involved with the strata remediation/fixing process. Their company's goal was to find clients who could be happy with their work. "Having to fix someone else's mistakes, over time, and invariably costing lotsa money, never led to happy clients.? Bob realized that "they want to leave their customers happy."

Psst! Bob said "Vinyl siding works on this 'Wet Coast' of ours." Hallo! The siding has drip holes built into the bottom of each sheet." Buildings with a southeast exposure, several stories high and stucco should be avoided. If built within the last 10 years, moisture should not be a problem. Did he get a book?

With \$692 in total, Bill Brendon tried his luck on 50/50 and lost. Beverley & Don Bonner shared their 'free range berries' as the ancillary prize, and Pres D won again. She then got to keep the victuals.
