

It is an opportunity for the students to experience other cultures and learn from the countries that they visit. Life long relationships are established and the students return home with greater maturity and global viewpoint.

Paul Geneau advised that historically the five Nanaimo clubs have hosted three inbound and outbound students but recently interest amongst the local students has been waning. In addition, it has been difficult to find host families. This year two outbound student's families have agreed to host inbound students so we anticipate a full complement of students next year. Paul is hopeful that we can build off this success and revitalize the program in following years.

Ken Hammer advised that the Mid-Island Rotary WCS Group or MIG has been partnership of 21 Rotary clubs that has existed for seven years. Ken thanked the generosity of our club members and advised that \$500 was raised last week for Senyo. The MIG member clubs meet every two months and it was inspired by Victoria's project Unity Committee.

Activities

There are currently various humanitarian projects in 11 countries. Among others these countries include Belize, Bolivia, Kenya, Peru, Uganda as well as Guatemala and Ghana.

Focus Areas

Disease prevention and treatment -we currently have 5 projects in 4 countries.
 Water sanitation-10 projects in 7 countries: building latrines
 Maternal and child health-1 project focused on health education
 Basic education and literacy-5 projects in 3 countries: included building a security wall for a school in Ghana as well the provision of basic school supplies and equipment
 Economic and community development-6 projects in 6 countries: such as micro credit programs

Rotarians go to the countries to not only participate in the implementation but to also ensure the project is being completed as planned and is sustainable.

Summary

Ken complimented us on being a nice audience or something like that...whatever he said he did seem sincere.

Ok back to the talk....The MIG has existed for seven years and has 21 clubs north of the Malahat, it has completed 21 sponsored projects in 5 of the 6 focus areas. \$60,000 of club funds have been leveraged to over \$600,000 in project funds with the various matching grants provided by Rotary International.

Bev Hilton advised that on October 8/14 they got confirmation that a \$66,500 usd grant has been approved to help fund a security wall/latrine construction project in Sunyani. Don then presented two cheques totaling \$1,500 from our club to Bev to assist in the Ghana project.

Ken Hammer advised that Jackson Kaguri, the author of Inner Ways to Change the World, is giving a talk November 5/14.
