Ron Blank mentioned about possible participation at VIEX to set up a table to sell Guatemala handicraft and Nepal T-shirts. After some deliberations, as it stands at the time of this write up, we are not going to participate any more.

Patrick Maguire, who has just returned from an Alaska cruise, spoke about a couple of influencing youth speaker at the RI conference 2015.

The first youth speaker who made a lasting impact on those Rotarians who attended the conference was Ms. Bella Field. She won the RIBI young Citizen Award. Bella was very close to her older sister Molly growing up. Molly would always tell her stories and read to her. However, as the fate would have it, Molly was only 8 when she was diagnosed with a rare inoperable and incurable brain tumor that led to her death 6 months later. The hospital that Molly was at is known as the Haven House Children's Hospital and it was Bella who decided to try and raise funds for the hospital and her sister Molly. With her first attempt, Bella was able to raise £3,000. It was at this time that Molly Fields wrote a trilogy titled "The Adventure of Ella Rose". She went on writing the novels even when her vision started to be destroyed by a brain tumor.

Bella then set out to raise more funds by selling her book her sister wrote and raised £5,000 with her next attempt. Having been successful twice she continued her fundraising efforts and over time raised over £90,000 for the Haven Children's Hospital.

The second youth speaker, Patrick, talked about a youth, Ms Lucia Gomez Garcia from Argentina. She said, speaking in English in front of thousands of Rotarians, that you are never too young to change the world. She said
