Good morning from Regina, Saskatchewan;

I left Nanaimo on Thursday without my notes from Wednesday's meeting. Now in Regina, I cannot provide a full account of the meeting. I can say that:

...the meeting was Ev Boegh's first meeting as our official club President, although she has been handling the role capably for the past few months.

We welcomed back Patrick Maguire from his pilgrimage across northern Spain which followed the Camino de Santiago. Patrick will give the club a presentation on the trials and exhilaration of making this pilgrimage.

Our speaker was Ewan Moir, CEO and President of the Port of Nanaimo. Ewan described the changing demographics of the mid-Island and how this will positively affects the growth of the Port. Ewan focused on three specific areas; expansion of the heavy industry at Duke Point, the replacement of light industry at the assembly wharves/ downtown, and the reconstruction of the boat basin. The assembly wharf will see a new auto completion centre, which will inventory automobiles for new car dealerships. This is expected to grow to 50,000 automobiles on-site. The boat basin docks are to be completely removed and replaced with new docks providing twice as much mooring capacity. The new docks will incorporate a public use area at water-level with outdoor seating and additional food service.

50/50 was a close call, but did not produce a winner; the pot continues to grow.
