Reports:

Speaker: Ken Hammer introduced Melissa Mills Destination Development & Industry Engagement Coordinator from Tourism Vancouver Island and Helga Lang, who is their volunteer coordinator. Lots of key points for Rotarians to be aware of:

Tourism Vancouver Island is run as a stakeholder model – if your business is involved in tourism, we welcome you in.
 Occasionally, we help communities with destination marketing.
 The core values are “work hard, play hard, integrity and trust”.
 Tourism in BC is all about trade and investment – everything around tourism gets our support if the group, company, whatever supports their community.

Recent stats from 2016:
 Tourism employees 133,000 people around the Province,
 17 billion for the Province,
 GNP – BC is the 2nd biggest,
 4 million tourists per year
 Tourism for Vancouver Island is about collaboration with all sectors of the business community. There are lots of exciting partnerships, i.e. new ones such as conservation and eco-tourism

Over the past 7 years Nanaimo has seen the highest numbers of tourists ever recorded. Indicators are everything from ferry and airplane service and hotel occupancy.

Major problems are not enough hotel rooms!
 Aboriginal groups are doing some amazing projects to bring people in to see their facilities.
 Airport is improving services to enhance tourism.
Destination Marketing:
 if you have a stakeholder/investor business, you can get in on their website for free!
 We are using social media more than ever.
 We will still be using paper but not to the same extent.
 We like to share real experiences on social media.

We try to create “signature and transformative” experiences. There is a shift into educational experiences which is new thinking for this organization. People have really expressed that they want to learn things. We want to treasure their bucket list items and make them even better! Close to 100 volunteers are trained to be ambassadors to help to showcase Nanaimo and the area. July and August we are the busiest. The largest tourism function is the cruise ship group – we are busy welcome, talking to people, getting shuttle. Some of the tourism offices use paid employees but the volunteers, meet, greet, educate the visitors and promote the region.
