Rotary Minute Doug Lum

Doug advised that he just returned from PETS (President Elect Training Seminar) in Seattle/ Tacoma and he is pumped up!! The focus is on youth and attracting younger adults to Rotary. There were great young speakers and Doug was particularly impressed with Brittany Arthur, who also spoke at the Rotary International convention in Toronto. Doug says that, not only can Rotary bring many things to you, but also assisted him in getting across the border. Haha. Doug is organizing a group from our club to attend the District Leadership Training Assembly May 10/19.

Ev advised that a group from our club raised \$1000 by walking 5kms in the Coldest Night of the Year fundraiser held last Saturday. This group included Denise L, Jodi, Lauren, Sheila and Sheila's daughter. Overall the event raised \$42,000 for the Samaritan House.

Dawn advised that the Salvation Army is selling Blueberry plants for \$10 and that she has purchase forms for completion. The plants will be available March 23/19 and can be picked up at the Salvation Army's Garage sale.

Guest Speaker Ken Hammer re: Everest Base Camp Trek

Ken relived the discussion with San that resulted in our international school rebuild project in Nepal. San had suggested that there was significant need in Nepal for Rotary help. To identify a specific project, San scheduled a family trip to his homeland. While in Nepal, the earthquake struck and destroyed hundreds of schools. Our project became clear, we could help rebuild a school.

On San's return, different Nepal fundraisers were scheduled, starting with a climb up Mt Benson. This proved to be a little challenging for the average Nanaimoite, so the venue was moved to Westwood Lake, where it has been held the last two years. With financial assistance from other clubs and the magic of matching grants \$60,000 USD has been raised for the Nepal school rebuild project.

In addition, the Nepal hike to Everest Base Camp got hatched with the first participants being Ken, Brenda, and Davis Hammer, and Robb Mowbray. They went in early November and flew into Kathmandu, where they stayed for a day and a half. They were able to view our school project and showed pictures of the roof built over the school with the money provided by our club.

They then flew to Lukla in a small plane, which was delayed for some time because of weather issues. The airport in Lukla is reportedly rated as the most dangerous airport in the world and the pictures supported this contention.

After acclimatizing, they started their hike to the Everest Base Camp at elevation of 18,000 feet. The hike was extremely challenging and both Robb and Davis experienced altitude sickness. Robb was not as sick, and a dose of Diamox got him back on track. Davis not so much, as he was bedridden for a day and one half.

On their trek, they had two guides and two porters, who became their very good friends. San showed off his scarf that the guides gave to each of them. Every night they stayed in a teahouse, all of which were family owned. They would be fed dinner, warmed up and then head up to their unheated bedrooms...brrr.

As the climbing season was ending, upon arriving at base camp, it had already been vacated for the year. Ken made it clear of how challenging the trek was, but also advised that it was extremely rewarding and thanked the club for it's support. Next years trip is scheduled for Oct 15.
