Rotary Minute

Since then, there has been significant development although the roads remain about the same. Wayne commented on how friendly and accepting the Ghanaians are, no matter how poor. Wayne and the Rotary team visited several hospitals to inspect equipment previously donated by Rotarians. Wayne advised that the reach and power of Rotary was very evident in Ghana.

Guest Speaker

Taryn O'Flanagan, executive director for VI Mental Health Society provided a brief overview of their operations. These include Gateway House, a 10-bed facility on Rosstown Rd. that is transitional. It is staffed around the clock and provides various skills program designed to return the residents back into the community. In addition, the Society opened Boundary Supportive Housing in 2016. It provides long term housing for 41 residents. They also operate the Campbell River Sobering and Assessment Center, a 14-bed facility on Dogwood Street.

Other initiatives include: 1) the Nanaimo Seniors Connect Centre for marginalized seniors, which operates a drop-in centre; 2) Mental Health First Aid Canada; 3) People First Media, which manages social media, produces TV shows and posts relevant articles on various mental health issues. In addition, in June, construction will begin on a 23-unit affordable housing building known as the Rosehill project.
