Rotary Minute

Don Bonner gave us an overview of the Tribal Canoe Journey that he participated in this last July. These journeys, which started 800 or 900 years ago, were originally trade driven, but now are culturally based. First Nations from both Canada and the US participate in the Journeys, all arriving at the shores of the Lummi Nation. Each Nation will travel to the next Nation and wait for an invitation to come ashore. Usually the stay will be one night and then the Nations will travel together on the next leg of the Journey.

All Nations, which total 110 canoes, arrived in Lummi within 2 hours of each other. In 2020, the destination for the Tribal Canoe Journey will be the Snuneymuxw Nation. Don says that about 10,000 will be arriving in Nanaimo, so they will be looking for community support.

Announcements

Guest Speaker Jennifer Vanderschaaf

Jennifer is the executive director of the Nanaimo Conservatory of Music. The conservatory started in 1977 at VIU (previously Malaspina College). In their first year, they had 30 students and 6 teachers. The conservatory has operated at their current location 375 Selby Street for seven years, when they purchased the building.

The conservatory uses the Suzuki music curriculum which parallels the linguistic learning of a native language. Currently, they are looking for additional Suzuki instructors. They also have two youth choirs, one of which won a competition in New York two years ago.

Students range from 3 to 85 years old at the Conservatory. Some of the students have special needs and many require financial assistance. Jennifer thanked our club for donating funds last year. The Conservatory is qualified to receive gaming funds, so we can consider donating some of the club's gaming funds. We can also provide some sweat equity assistance in the future, as well.

Rod is playing six instruments in several musical numbers honouring the twentieth-year anniversary for Schmooze Productions. There will be shows at the Harbourside Theatre September 27-29 and Oct 4-6. Tickets are \$15-\$20.
