Guest Speaker Carrie Corfield from the Island Crisis Society

Carrie says their mandate is "to provide shelter and care for those in need reflecting the love of God". The Society manages Newcastle Place, currently a temporary facility, put in place to deal with the tent city crisis of 2018. They are located right by the White Spot on Terminal Ave. B.C. Housing owns the property and brought in camp trailers to setup the site.

Our club volunteered in the spring, moving topsoil to the wooden garden beds built and placed throughout Newcastle Place. Carrie advised of the significant positive influence on those individuals living at Newcastle. Many of the residents are very active in maintaining the Therapeutic gardens.

Island Crisis Society began in 1989 when they started the Samaritan House on Nicol Street and they currently operate 13 different programs.



Carrie advised that a recent census indicates there is approximately 600 homeless individuals in our city. This number does not reflect the "hidden" homeless that are couch surfing and moving from friend to friend. Carrie also addressed the many causes of homelessness which include mental health, addictions, residential schools, high rents, domestic violence and family rejection just to name a few.

The Island Crisis Society, partnering with B.C. Housing and the city of Parksville, are just opening Orca Place in Parksville. It is a permanent supportive housing facility, able to accommodate 52 residents.
