President Doug opened the meeting with club members singing 'O Canada' accompanied by Rod Mont. This was followed by invocation.



Introduction of visiting Rotarians included Jason Bradley from the downtown club. Jason is leader for the Area 4 Youth Exchange program. Also introduced were Rotary Exchange students Catherine Chen from Taiwan and Igor Kowalski from Poland.

Past President Ev let us know about the Youth Reconciliation Conference. The Multi-Cultural Society and Rotary provided \$10,000 for this event.

Denise Larson provided a Rotary Moment where she detailed some of the accomplishments of our club in the nearly 25 years of our history. Denise reminded us that we have lots to celebrate considering that we have done so many projects in the community; roofing, fencing, building bathrooms, creating the Parkway Challenge, Swing into Spring, planting trees and flowers . . . and as many international projects.



Nelson Allen reminded us of the "Every Rotarian, Every Year" campaign to raise, at minimum, \$25 USD from every Rotarian. Nelson provided the example of how these funds can support projects like the Nepal Mobile Medical facility, where the Mid Island Group provided \$6,000, which was matched many times, raising a total of \$40,000 for the project.

Tyler Vaughan provided a "Classification Talk" this morning. This was an emotional and captivating presentation of his approach to life.

Tyler's profession is Cannabis Ambassador, working with Salvation Botanicals. He sees his role as "bringing people together for a common interest". This, Tyler sees, is like Rotary – for the betterment of all.



Tyler was born in Sechelt, raised in Richmond, lived in Kelowna and then to Vancouver Island; finishing high school in Ladysmith. Joined the armed forces after graduating from high school and spent 3 years in the army. Tyler credits the army with helping him to focus and to mature. He served as an electronics technologist while in the army.

Moving to Calgary when released from the army, Tyler tried electrician apprenticeship and then started as a personal trainer and yoga instructor. Yoga taught Tyler to understand simplicity and gratitude.

Returning to Nanaimo, Tyler shared that this was the darkest moments of his life. He could not overcome his depression. He took 3 years to climb out of depression and learn that mental health is a very large issue for his generation. This issue has touched, in some way, nearly everyone. Tyler recognized the opportunities that Nanaimo presents and looks for greater involvement with the community and Rotary.
