Guest Speaker Gerry Beltgens

Gerry is the executive director for Disaster Aid Canada and coordinator for the shelter boxes, he started September 1/19. Gerry is a member of the Ladysmith Rotary Club. He visited the Bahamas after Category 5 Hurricane Dorian. The storm destroyed 13,000 homes and it is estimated that it will cost about 9 billion dollars to rebuild.

Disaster Aid Canada sent down 101 tents and 300 bed packs, partnering with local Rotarians to provide relief.

In addition, they also provided water filtration systems as clean water was in short supply. Locally, Disaster Aid Canada is spearheading emergency preparedness in our communities.
