President Doug opened the meeting with club members singing 'O Canada' accompanied by Rod Mont. This was followed by invocation.

Guests this morning included: Ian Williams from the Downtown Rotary club. Ian was taking photographs to be used for the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of Rotary in Nanaimo; Jane Bremner, a guest of Graham Calder; Muriel Wildman, VIU Rotaract club and Roberta (Muriel's mom); Riley, cousin of Dominic,



Rotary Minute: Donna Allen and San Mahara provided an entertaining overview the Catch a Smile program. Donna wore her tooth-fairy costume and San performed with Mr Chewie, (the spitting dinosaur). The program teaches children about dental health through songs, games and materials given to the children. This program is sponsored by our club.

## Presentation: San Antonio Aguas Calientes, Guatemala

Graham Calder provided an interesting and educational presentation about this area of Guatemala, where our club members and other Island clubs are doing Rotary projects. Graham's comments covered historical and social context, and our Rotary work in the

There are 17 million people in Guatemala; 40% of these are indigenous Mayan people. Recent history includes 36 years of military rule, ending in 1996. The current status of many of the Guatemalan people is a result of the difficult years of military rule, which included the death or "missing" of 200,000 people.

The area is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Leading economic advantages are tourism and coffee production.

Club projects in San Antonio Aguas Calientes include improvements to student and family housing, and supplemental training for teachers. These projects are also supported by the Nanaimo North and Downtown clubs.

Schools in Guatemala have costs to be paid by the students. This limits access to education for poorer students. There is also Rotary support for supplemental programs, both as additional education and for vocational training. A "sewing lab" provides training and employment.

Graham was able to show photos and describe housing rehabilitation, which starts from the foundation and completes an entire house with more durable materials and common construction techniques.
