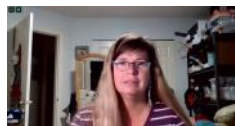
No Anniversaries this week.

Meeting Notes - October 7th, 2020 by Randall Taylor, photos from Jodi Rogers.

This was another Zoom meeting as we continue this format to meet Covid regulations. This morning we had 30 participants at the meeting.

Guests this morning included Assistant District Governor Wayne Anderson and Veronica Szick, president elect of the Oceanside Rotary Club. Also in attendance was Doha and Asmaa Alkhatib, our guest speakers. (Some members had trouble connecting to Zoom for this morning's meeting. Club secretary sent an email to all members on October 6th to provide sign-in details).

Veronica Szick attended our meeting to let us know about Oceanside Rotary's new fundraising event, "Running of the Balls". This event is similar to a "ducky race" with 1,000 numbered balls to be released from the top of a hill. First ball to the bottom is the winner of \$1,000, with 2nd and 3rd prize also being awarded. Tickets are \$20 with a maximum of 1,000 tickets being sold. To date there have been 400 tickets sold. We are all working to find innovative ways to raise funds for Rotary, this project is this year's replacement for the Oceanside "Bond Night".



Presentation: Doha Alkhatib and her mother, Asmaa, were our presenters this morning. The seven members of the Alkhatib family are recent arrivals in Canada from Syria.



The family lived in Aleppo until their house was bombed in 2012. Some family members were taken to Turkey by ambulance with the other members following behind. The family spent four years in Turkey as refugees. At that time there were 3.5 million Syrian refugees in Turkey, so they realized that they needed to leave for a better life. For three years now the Alkhatib family has been living in Canada. There are all learning to speak English and becoming Canadian citizens. Doha is studying to become a dental hygienist.

The Alkhatib family is now working to sponsor Doha's aunt, uncle and their four children from Lebanon, as refugees in Canada, (the Kraydi family). The Kraydi family is living in a refugee camp in Lebanon and cannot return to Syria. They have raised one-half of the funds required to sponsor six Kraydi family members. Doha and her family are asking for donations to help in this sponsorship. To date \$17,000 has been raised to bring the family to Canada however \$16,000 more is needed. Rod and Jill have generously offered to match donations from our club for this effort.

The fundraising process and sponsorship is overseen by the Anglican diocese. The Anglican diocese has set up a trust-fund for this family. The total of \$33,000 will cover the family's first year expenses here in Canada, (rent, food, medical expenses, utilities, etc.).

Brandon provided a **Rotary Moment** which asked us, for this Thanksgiving, to challenge ourselves to find ways to be of service, while considering how fortunate we are.

Announcements:

- ◇ President Anna let us know that the Lantzville club would like us to consider an occasional joint meeting with their club, during this time of Covid isolation. Please email Anna with your thoughts on this type of meeting.
- ◇ Good Food program needs volunteers and drivers. This will continue every second Thursday through to March of 2021. This requires bagging and delivering enough food for nearly 500 families! See Ev Boegh for details and to volunteer. (note: Jill and Doha have volunteered for this coming week)
- ◇ A reminder to sell cheese for our club fundraiser. Emails were sent to all members with the details and promotional material.
- ◇ San let us know that some of the funds for Nepal have arrived in Nepal...about \$5,000 of the \$33,000 goal.
- ◇ Patrick announced the receipt of the Guatemala grant to provide food for the people of San Antonio Aguas Calientes (\$7,000 USD). Covid has shut down the community with no government support, nor tourists arriving. These funds will last until the end of October. Disaster Aid Canada has been supporting this effort.

We then tried a Zoom choir to sing happy birthday to Darlington, (did not go well).

Bill Brendon won the 50/50 draw. We recited the 4-way test and our goodbye's.
