There were 26 participants at our Zoom meeting this morning. It was noted that “personal chats” in Zoom is operating again. Vice President Rod Mont was in charge of the meeting and led us in O’ Canada on the saxophone followed by an invocation.

Our guest this morning was Kimberley Barrett from the Rotaract club.

Bill Brendon provided an impromptu Rotary Moment. Caught off-guard, Bill recovered with good advice to be prepared, do your research, and use the resources which are available to you. This might start by reading the Weekly Wakeup to know if you have duties at the meeting, using the R.I. website or other Rotary services.

Incoming President Janice Krall is drafting plans and goals for her Rotary year. Her questionnaire for club members is designed to provide club members a voice in plans for the coming year so please participate, there are only 15 completed questionnaires to date.

Dawne Anderson encouraged participation in the Salvation Army’s fundraising projects. The blueberry event will be completed by this Saturday however continuing projects include Heart Healthy Pet Treats and Panago Pizza promotion which can be picked up Monday to Friday between 9:00 and 4:00. Ev Boegh is testing the “map my walk” app which is downloadable to cell phones. Four club members are assisting by using the app. When tests are complete, the app will be used to challenge “the world” to walk 25 kilometers.

Food Share is on-going. Members and volunteers are encouraged to meet on Thursdays at 8:30, at Beban Centennial building to help sort and bag produce for delivery to over 500 local families. The sorting is done by about 11:00. This is a weekly event.

Trash Talk and Hike takes place every second Saturday. Place and time are on our website calendar. The suggestion was made that the club include some promotion showing that this is a Rotary project wherever the Hike takes place.

Kimberly Barrett let us know that Rotaract is transitioning from a University club to a community club. A current fundraising project is to sell “Vaccinated” bracelets for those who have received their Covid 19 vaccinations. A minimum donation of \$5 per bracelet. Such a great idea that our club ordered 25 bracelets – thank you Doug Pearson. Additional bracelets can be purchased through nanaimorotaract@gmail.com Kimberly also let us know that Rotaract is holding a “geography night” on May 14th at 7:30. Club members are invited to join.

Rotaract is working on a research project into pandemics to determine how Rotary can help prevent and end future pandemics.

Patrick provided an update on “25 for our 25th”, a celebration of our Clubs 25th anniversary. The committee members are contacting 25 organizations to participate with us during the year. This includes developing a participant website. The participation period will be May 25th to June 25th. There is discussion of awarding a community Paul Harris fellowship as part of the celebration. Cathy Graham is looking into the 25 bikes for 25 kids project. If viable she will need some volunteers.

May 29th from 10:00 to 2:00 is our Shredding and Bottle Drive day. This will be (again) at Nanaimo North Town Centre. Save the date to volunteer and tell friends and neighbours about the event.
