April - Blueberry bush sale

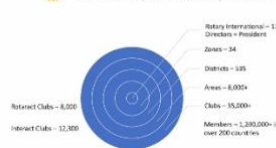
May – Mothers' Day High Tea (volunteers needed)

 - Direction-alignment-commitment

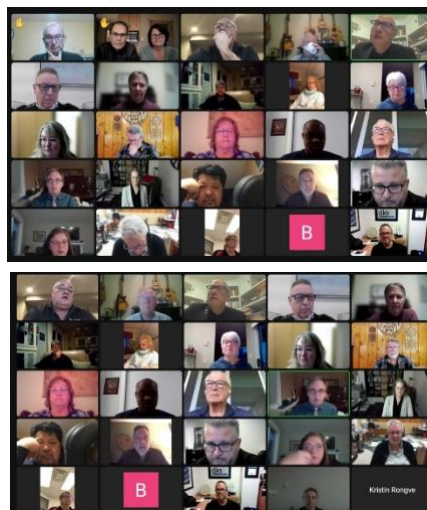
