In 1995 in area 4 and Lanztville Rotary were meeting, but the club had outgrown itself. Rod thought that another breakfast club was feasible and Daybreak was born. 3 clubs sponsored. Aug21/1995 12 Rotarians & 1 guest.

The name Nanaimo Daybreak was decided and dec13/1995 Charter meeting. Today is the anniversary. We honoured Denise Larson, Ev Boegh, Rod Mont, all present today at the meeting, as Charter members. We have many Charter members who are still active members as well.

Presentation from Dana Miles : from Salish Storm board member and Founder for Indigenous Hockey programme. This idea started from the lack of support for Indigenous youth and started in 2019. Grassroots was Dana and her husband showing the kids dry land hockey skills. Eventually they approached the CofN for support to get onto the ice rinks. Today, 40-60 players and the programme has expended into other communities too.

They are having a Fund raiser- New Year's party at Beban Park and dance. A lot of food and cash bar Johnny and the Inappropriates are the musical entertainment. Check their Facebook and Event Brite for details. Goal is to sell 400 tickets and some sponsorship opportunities too. \$80/ tickets or research a table

Presentation: Paul at Unitarian Shelter

Started 15 years ago and counting . 2018 year round shelter now. Open to guests dinner and a warm bed, with 27 beds total and breakfast. Great neighborhood relationships. They are called guests as a respect to all. They will reserve beds for guests who need this help. A goal is to have a stable consistent environment and shelter for people.

Currently, the RCMP believe Nanaimo has 800-1000 or more homeless individuals. A large increase over the last couple of years.

There are only 84 beds available in the City and many more are needed.

Vulnerability Assessments (a VAT) is a tool that the Unitarian Shelter uses now to help understand and place individuals and fill basic needs.

The success so far of this programme is:

completed VATs 44; Housing Registration Applications 60; Housing Placements 37

Paul shared stories of many displaced people. Erika answered some questions from the audience President Dave shared **Elections** are next week, and most positions are filled. We are looking for a new VP. Rod Mont will take on the Bulletin. And we need a new Public Relations officer, as Jodi will step down. This meeting will be the AGM.
