Our International Services Director Duane give us a good overview of Daybreak's world community service. Duane invited anyone who is interested to join the world community service committee. Our re-occurring commitments include Shelter Box <https://www.shelterboxcanada.org/>, Disaster Aid <https://www.disasteraid.ca/>, Rotary's Polio



Eradication <https://www.rotary.org/en/our-causes/ending-polio>, and a Guatemala student sponsorship in memory of our past member Ron Blank. Our current international projects include contributions to the Peace International School in Rwanda, the Asaba library project and bore hole project in Nigeria, the SHEEP project and medical support program in Ghana, the Bee Keeper project in Liberia, a computer project in Nepal, and a book project in Guatemala. Daybreak Rotary is one of 22 clubs in the central Vancouver Island area who work together in a group called Mid-Island Group or MIG. MIG has been operating since 2007 and has leveraged the \$200,000 that Rotary



clubs have provided into \$2.5 million of funding for projects through various matching grants. We will get more information regarding our international projects in up-coming meetings.

Ev reminded us of the Coldest Night of the Year walk which will happen on February 24th.
