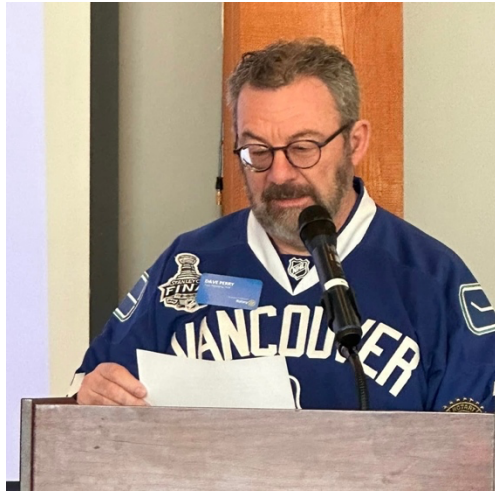

Some of the programs for school students are a speaker talking about the dangers of speed and high risk behaviour targeting grade 11 and 12 students and a program for grade 10 students on the steps to get a driver's license. Under the category of road safety and community involvement, there are programs on New to BC, Mature Driving, and Winter Driving. Rowena also talked about the 73 Speed Watch groups across BC with 18 of them on Vancouver Island.
