President Daryl opened the meeting with O Canada led by Rod M. on his sax. Terry G. is inspired by all of the work that our club members do in the community and around the world. After the land acknowledgement, Mike G. did the introductions. We welcomed our guest speaker Gary O'Brien, Alan Rinehart, Corbin Cunningham, and Theo Postulo.



For the Rotary Moment, Valri C. told us that she joined Rotary because she loved all of the volunteer work that we do and that she wanted to be part of it.



Ken H. introduced our guest speaker, retired constable Gary O'Brien. Gary spoke to us about Frauds and Scams. AI has allowed scammers to replicate voices of family members. The fake voice then tries to convince the target person that money needs to be sent because of an emergency. It can be quite effective because it can sound like the actual family member. Gary said that the chances of someone getting scammed in their lifetime is now 1 in 2 and the average person loses \$7,000 - \$8,000.

There are likely even more scams out there because people don't like to report that they have been scammed. One site that Gary recommends is <https://antifraudcentre-centreantifraude.ca/index-eng.htm> which can be found by typing "phonebusters" in an internet search.



Gary also talked about several other scams including the selling tickets scam, the Whatsapp scam, the text scam (receiving a text saying that your vehicle was detected speeding), the Apple iTune scam, the lotto scam, the romance scam, and the fake tech support scam. We were told that it is important to protect our digital ID. Do not fill out online surveys which ask for our favourite colour etc. We were told to "Think about it" before falling for a scam. Here were some tips. 1. Did I even buy a ticket? 2. Be cautious if something is aimed at tugging at your heartstrings. 3. Is the offer too good to be true? 4. A red flag is that something is threatening or urgent. 5. Get a callback number. 6. Double checking online is important – see the link above. "Google is your friend." 7. Hang up!

Kris R. is starting up another round of "Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?" She emphasized in her very subtle way that if people commit to going to a dinner, they must actually show up for dinner. Who knew?
