Meeting Notes – December 11, 2024, by Scott Manson, photos by Cathy Manson



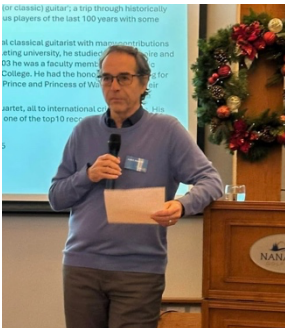

Alan Rinehart did his Classification Talk this morning. He started by saying that being born in 1948 means that dying prematurely is now not an option. He also revealed that he is related, distantly, to some famous people with his same last name. He was born in Michigan, home of the invention “Kitty Litter”, and a stop on the



Underground Railroad. He enjoyed riding motorcycles as a young lad. His father was a carpenter who fought in WWII. As an only child of the late 50’s and early 60’s, he was drawn to the plight of migrant workers and was involved in helping them out. This led to his studies of Sociology and Social Work at University. Even though he was a student, and was deferred from being drafted, with another war looming and Nixon proposing the Draft Lottery, Alan moved to Canada. He visited Toronto, then Ottawa. It is in Ottawa where he first got into music after visiting a Coffee House there that had hosted many famous artists. After hearing a Classical Guitarist play there one evening, his career path was

set! He moved to Vancouver in '72, because “That was where it was at!” He took some formal music training in England, then got involved with the Music Program at UBC. His band played on the radio show “Disc Drive” on CBC! He and his band played at EXPO '86, and he giggered at all the events he could. He thinks his headstone should read: “Musicians don’t retire, they expire!” or “I’m dead. Other than that, I’m fine!” In answer to the question: “Why Rotary?”, Alan talked about meeting a few of our Club Members at a Sea Wolves Men’s Cancer Group meeting and decided to join after attending one of our meetings. Alan now teaches a program at Elder Collage: “Art and Times of the Classical Guitar” Welcome Alan!!

Valri as our Sarge at Arms asked some Sun questions (from our speaker a few weeks back) to determine order of breakfast with correct answers. Rod M., Denise L., Denise D., Evelyn B., and Nelson A. are our club’s Charter Members who are still active members.
